How do I know when to report?

- Your juror number will be mailed to you, report when your number is called
- Check the Jury Message Phone at 505-865-4639, ext 4 or website <u>every Friday</u> <u>after 5:00 PM</u>
- The message will tell you when to report or give you further instructions
- Verify attendance the night before jury selection by checking the Jury Message Phone or website

Qualifications to Serve as a Juror

- You are qualified to serve as a juror if you meet the following conditions:
- 1. United States Citizen
- 2. 18 years of age or older
- 3. Not currently on felony probation or parole
- Must be a resident of the county where you are called to jury service

Notify the jury clerk if you do not meet these conditions

Term of Service

- Petit jurors in the Valencia County serve for a term of 2 months
- You only report for service when your juror number is called during your 2 month term

How was I selected for jury service?

- Section 38-5-3 NMSA 1978 provides for the selection of jurors
- Jurors are selected from a list of registered voters, licensed drivers and personal income tax filers

Difficulty hearing? Need an interpreter?

- Assistive listening devices are available at all times for any juror who requests one
- Interpreters are scheduled when a juror requests one on their questionnaire
- If you need a sign language interpreter, let the jury clerk know and one will be provided

Juror Compensation and Hours

- Jurors may receive compensation for jury service at \$6.25 per hour
- Jurors may receive \$0.29 round-trip mileage
- Court hours are 8 AM-5 PM with a lunch hour
- There are numerous breaks in the morning and afternoon of trials

What if I'm a public employee, federal employee or a public school teacher?

- Public employees, city, state, county, public universities, or public school employee <u>are</u> <u>paid by their employer</u> for jury service during their normal working hours
- Federal employees will be paid unless they otherwise notify the court
- Contractors working for the government you may be paid, ask for more information

Certificates of Attendance

- Jurors may request a certificate of attendance for their employer from the court
- Employers can also request a juror's specific attendance record

Meals

- The court only provides meals during final deliberations
- Court security will allow jurors to bring in meals, snacks or bottled water as long as items can be scanned by court security.

Electronic Devices and Other Prohibited Items

- Court security prohibits cell phones, weapons of any type and any other item not allowed by their protocol
- Attorneys, court officers and occasionally news media may bring in electronic devices with the judge's permission or for use in conducting business before the court

Juror Attire

- Jurors are representatives of the court and should dress comfortably and avoid distracting others by their attire
- Shorts, tank-tops or cutoffs are not appropriate attire for a courtroom
- Formal dress <u>is not required</u> and men are not required to wear coats and ties

Consideration for Postponement

Considered

- Full-time students: **Class schedule**
- Medical conditions which prevent you from serving:Doctor's note
- Caregiver: Doctor's note
- Age: 75 or older may request permanent exemption
- Out-of-county residents: proof of residency
- Non-citizens: proof of citizenship

No postponements without documentation

Not Considered

- Planned vacations
- Work-related training or travel
- Scheduled doctor appointments
- Too busy
- Know a judge or judges
- Know police officers
- Taking online courses
- We will work with scheduling conflicts but will not excuse you from serving
